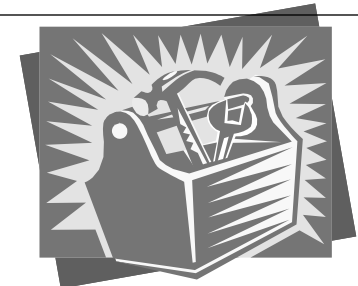

“Positive Parenting” is a video-based parent education program focusing on alternatives to physical punishment in the discipline of children. It was developed jointly by family educators of the University of Minnesota Extension Service and University of Wisconsin Extension.

Class 1: Effective Parenting Tools

Every family is unique. What works in your family? Give and get ideas from this unique class that gets right down to the nuts and bolts of parenting.

Class 2: Raising Siblings

“They really do love each other but it seems they fight all the time.” Have you ever heard these words coming from your mouth? Each child is different and unique. What works for one may not work for another. Have you been challenged by the statement, “You always let her do it, but never me!”?

Class 3: Discipline and Consequences

Each parent has his/her own style. Many of us parent like we were parented. How do we teach, keep it fair and appropriate are some of the questions we will cover in this session.

Class 4: Respect and Responsibility

Family meetings, assigned chores and recognizing a child’s place in the family all add to teaching respect and responsibility.

Class 5: Attention, Encouragement and Self Esteem

Why do kids need to feel good about themselves? How does positive self esteem nurture development? How much attention do kids really need?
